



Stratford Police Service in Partnership with Stratford Central, St. Michael and Stratford Northwestern schools are pleased to offer parents of students attending these schools a drug education night Featuring Sgt Tony Burrows of the Stratford Police Service.

Tony is a 32 year veteran of policing and has spent a third of his career in drug enforcement. Tony began his career in policing with the Guelph Police in 1986. Tony held several positions within that police service, such as: Criminal Investigations Division, Intelligence Unit, Drug Unit, Traffic Unit, and Use of Force Instructor (Training Unit). During his tenure in the drug unit Tony was trained in drug enforcement, mobile and technical surveillance. In 1994 Tony became a member of the Criminal Intelligence Service of Ontario Undercover Operator pool which he is still a member of to date.

In 1999, Tony resigned from the Guelph Police Service and joined the Stratford Police Service, his home town. As a Stratford Police Service member Tony has worked in Uniform Patrol, Drug Unit twice, and as the high school resource officer. During Tony's time in the Drug Unit he was involved in undercover and clandestine operations in conjunction with local, provincial and federal law enforcement agencies.

In 2004 Tony was seconded to the Ontario Police College as an instructor for 2 ½ years. Tony currently serves as the Sergeant in charge of Training for the police service.
